Your donated books raise funds and spread the joy of reading. Give your books a second life and help us make an impact.



Memorial Plaque Dedication Ceremony for Bos Stevens

As part of National Library Week, a
Memorial Plaque Dedication Ceremony
was held on April 8 at the Starkville Public
Library to honor the life and legacy of
Arthur Boswell "Bos" Stevens, III. The
event celebrated Bos' many contributions
to the Starkville-Oktibbeha County Public
Library System and FOL. Highlights
included a plaque unveiling, a children's
book donation in his memory, and touching
remarks from library staff and current and
past FOL board members. His wife, Kim
Stevens, and family members shown at
right were present for the dedication.

Bos, who passed in 2023, was a passionate advocate for literacy. He served on the FOL Board, creating whimsical displays and shelving still used today. He also authored several children's books, originally for his grandchildren, and shared them at library events.

The memorial plaque now hangs in the book sale room—a fitting tribute to someone who gave so much to the library and community.

From Birthday Gifts to Bookshelves: How Al Is Shaping Literature

Last year a friend was approaching a milestone birthday, and I was trying very hard to come up with a useful and memorable gift for someone who doesn't need anything. I stumbled upon the idea of generating a poem to commemorate this milestone birthday. Luckily for me, I have a friend who is an AI (artificial intelligence) expert, so I turned to her for suggestions on how to do this. Her response was "give me a few characteristics and I'll get back to you." A few days later I had a funny, interesting, accurate, and charming poem. I framed it and presented it to the birthday person at his birthday party. It was a huge hit!

From my personal example, AI can clearly be useful in literature. In some cases, such as the one above, it could even result in the product!

How does AI affect the literary world? While most of us have experienced AI through chatbots or something similar at this point, we may be less aware that we are reading products generated by an Al program. In a very interesting article "The Intersection of Technology & Literature: How AI is Changing the Writing Experience" (no author, September 8, 2023, *Medium*, obtained on the internet), this very good review notes that AI can be used for grammar and style checking, to generate content for products like poetry and fiction, to sort through many texts to identify a pattern or theme, and for language translation.

This unnamed author notes that publishers find it useful for manuscript analysis, plagiarism detection, and genre analyses, as well as for market research. They even note that some audio books are produced with AI voices!

Given all of these applications and likely more to come, there are many concerns and issues facing how AI is used for good or bad (ex: generating a college term paper for a grade). While most of us are not yet using many high-level AI programs directly like my friend, that usage may come in the future. Meanwhile, stay aware of these possible uses and when you might be using them-even if at first it doesn't seem likely!



This poem was created in ChatGPT from the feature article, but its errors show why AI-generated content must always be checked.
